# 4.3 Issues related to Rural Issues:

### **Rural Areas:**

• Areas with low population density located in the countryside outside towns and cities.

• Canada is a vast country covering over **9.5** million km<sup>2</sup>.

Of that, **95%** of Canada's land mass is considered rural or remote.

• Rural areas are not just low populated farm land.

• A rural area is any area with low population and low population density regardless of terrain.

• This could be communities surrounded by forests of even located in the middle of the desert.





 Each rural community is unique in size, population and distance to a major urban centre and each face different social, health and economic challenges.

• There are many challenges and issues that revolve around the study of rural communities.

As time goes on and Canada enters the 21<sup>st</sup> century, rural areas face more challenges.

## Issues in Rural Area:

### **1.Population:**

Canada's population trend and distribution has changed over time.

• In particular the trend towards urbanization.


With low populations in rural areas a lower tax base is present.

In particular when people begin to move away from rural areas the tax base begins to shrink from what it once was.

• With less people living in the communities means less money being cycled through the community.

• Thus businesses and the economy begins to suffer.







#### 2. Service Availability:

 With less taxes being gathered due to a declining population different services that is provided by the government begin to disappear or become less effective.

 Closures of hospitals, school, and Government buildings begin to take place due to costs to upkeep and the overall demand compared to the population.  Most rural communities depend on cars/automobiles for their primary form of transportation.

 Where there is no public transportation in majority of rural areas.

 The maintenance of roadways is another cost that rural areas face.  Sometimes there are long stretches of roads between one community to another.

 An overwhelming challenge of living in a rural and remote community is the lack of transportation and the need to travel great distances for goods and services.  Families who live in rural and remote Canada also have limited choice and higher travel costs associated with accessing services.

 Access to services is one of the main issues people living in rural and remote areas of Canada face.
